Pastor's Page

"All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, 'What does this mean?'"
--Acts 2: 12

After a painful event, like a medical crisis or death of a loved one or pandemic, it's human to process the event by asking, "What does this mean?"

This isn't an intellectual question like asking for a translation of an unfamiliar language. This is a search for meaning, which is part of healing and integrating. Why did this happen to me? Why did this friend die so young? Why did my child get cancer but not me? Why did the storm destroy my home but not my neighbor's home?

Jesus never told his followers that they'll never experience trouble. In fact, he guaranteed that they WILL experience all sorts of painful events, perhaps even as a result of following him.

What Jesus promised is to remain present. There's no trouble or pain that can scare him away. He's already been crucified. He already died, was buried, and even went to hell, according to the Apostle's Creed. He knows what it's like to suffer, and Jesus isn't blaming you for suffering either. He will join you in your suffering and won't leave you there alone.

The resurrected Jesus Christ kept appearing to people, walking around with them and eating meals and even breaking through locked doors. He sits with the disciples who are trying to make sense of what has happened and understand what God is doing.

All during the Easter season (which extends through most of the month of May this year), we read from the Gospels about these post-resurrection appearances of Jesus and also from the book of Acts. Acts tells the story of the disciples after Jesus's resurrection, how the Holy Spirit shows up at Pentecost, affirms believers in their faith, and shows them how to keep telling their story.

It wasn't straightforward or easy to make sense of Jesus's death, and when telling the story of Jesus, no disciple was encouraged to leave out the painful parts. Can resurrection even make sense without first dying?

Wherever you are in your journey of faith, Jesus is traveling alongside you. And all of us believers—who together become the body of Christ still active and alive in the world—are here to testify to this same Jesus with our presence, too. Resurrection is real, life is eternal, and God is at work.


