

Pastor's Page

[The disciples] replied, "We have nothing here but five loaves and two fish." And [Jesus] said, "Bring them here to me."

Matthew 14:17-18

Do you ever look around and notice only the things you *don't* have?

Maybe you look around the sanctuary and remember people who used to show up, or how there were once more kids in Sunday School classes. Maybe you remember days in the past when you enjoyed better health and less pain, you could *do* more things because your body gave you more options. Maybe you remember having more money in the past, and you fondly recall the choices you could make when you weren't having to watch your finances so closely.

Do you ever stop and notice the things you do have? This is the wisdom of "counting your blessings!" And it isn't easy to do—this is a spiritual discipline.

When Jesus instructed his disciples to feed a large crowd, they said, "We have nothing here." But that wasn't really true! Five loaves of bread and two fish are *not nothing*! Now, granted, it wasn't enough to feed a whole crowd, as far as the disciples could imagine, but it also wasn't *nothing*.

Jesus asked them to bring what they had. And in the hands of Jesus, somehow that small amount of food that was not enough—it became *more than enough*. If we believe God can summon all of creation out of nothing, then can't God also make plenty out of our scarcity?

Share what you have. Note the monthly "Big Ask" by collecting items for our food pantry partners St. Anthony's and Isaiah 58. Add a can of soup into your grocery cart and share with neighbors who visit our Little Free Pantry in the church yard.

In the hands of Jesus, every small gift becomes more than enough.

Reparations Update

In the near future, you will hear about a program being rolled out to pay reparations for the use of African American Spirituals, and their use within worship. You will hear about what the program entails, how it will look, and how it is a work of the congregation to promote justice. To prepare us, here are two important definitions we should keep in mind:

REPARATIONS - The use of the word reparations is most often used in the US to describe the process of *making amends* for the historical and systematic wrong done to African Americans. In this case, the historical and systematic wrong is related to never properly giving credit to the body of music that is African American Spirituals. A number cannot and need not be assigned to monetize the historical wrong, but we can and should as believers in justice affect the future. Pay it forward, so to speak.

ROYALTIES - The church music industry relies on royalties generated by the licensing of copyrighted hymns as a primary form of payment to lyricists, hymn tune writers, arrangers, or a publisher holder of the copyright. A royalty is a payment to a copyright owner for use of a hymn printed in a bulletin and/or broadcasted/streamed. The copyright holder may compensate the lyricists, composers, and arrangers that originated the hymn.

Meet the Author Event

We are excited to welcome Ciera McElroy to talk about her new book: *Atomic Family*; a story about a family living in South Carolina in 1961 and their reactions to the possibility of nuclear war. We are also excited to welcome Bob Chamberlin and hear about his autobiography, *What's Next?* We always knew he was an extremely talented organist, but that's just the tip of the iceberg. If we are lucky, Pastor Jeff may also be in attendance to celebrate his birthday and discuss his books: *Looking for a City* and *Sycamore Tree Service and Other Stories*.

Save the Date...




