## **Pastor's Page**

#### "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away." --Jesus (Gospel of Mark 13:31)

When the Christmas carols and winter songs begin playing, we know how to interpret this sign of the times: it's holiday season, and in our culture, that means shopping and party-ing.

It's great for the economy, and during this time of year, retailers count on people spending extra money on gifts, treats, and food and drinks. There are some vacation days coming, students approaching a break from classes, and maybe some time for reflection on the past year and on life in general.

What story are you telling in your life? Do you dream of being known by your spending habits? Is life meant to be simply enjoyed and used up? Are you who you are because of relationships where you belong—in your neighborhood, in your family, in your career? And what's the point of all of this, anyway?

While the world prepares for a shopping and money-spending holiday, Christians are preparing for the return of Jesus. Oh, didn't you know that's what Advent is about? We're not celebrating Christmas to re-enact the first coming of Jesus Christ, but to remember the things Jesus taught about his return. Spoiler alert: it's not cute or pretty.

The stories of Advent are about God's reign, bringing harmony to relationships, making rough places smooth, healing what is broken, restoring creation. God could do this with a gentle touch, but humanity is incredibly resistant to making changes. Thus the wars and all the other scary stuff.

The story of our faith is the story of resurrection—death does not have the last word, but we worship a God of life. In the coming year, we'll read from Mark's Gospel, which scholars believe was written to be read aloud like a story.

Mark's Gospel begins with Jesus being baptized by John in the Jordan River—there's no birth story! Jesus arrives on the scene speaking like a prophet, telling the truth about the world and calling the people of God to repentance and action. Mark's Gospel ends with an empty tomb and witnesses who "said nothing to anyone because they were afraid."

But someone did tell, because we know the story, and we're still telling it. It is God's story, and we are in it.

#### Year End Giving

As we move toward ending the year on a positive note (or at least having a less negative balance), as chair of the Finance Committee I was asked by the Council at its last meeting to provide an update on where our finances stand. The numbers for November are not in yet as the newsletter goes to press so I need to provide an update as of the end of October. Our actual giving through the end of October was \$8,501 higher than anticipated while our actual expenses were \$1,424 higher than budgeted. The congregation approved a budget that anticipated a deficit of \$30,497 for the year, which based on the projected budget, meant that we would have a deficit of \$47,899 by the end of October (due in large part to the Endowment Fund support of \$21,885 not being posted until December). In terms of net income to expense we are \$7,077 ahead so we are currently only \$40,822 behind. December giving is often twice as much as many other months so hopefully we can continue to bring down the anticipated deficit before the end of the year. Whatever support you can provide in this last month is greatly appreciated. —Dan Flaxbart

#### Gethsemane Youth Group Fundraiser


